- PROJECTS 2025 - 2035**
- 1 Reconfigure Bus Stop to improve access and movement. Upgraded Arrival and Orientation Zone. Provide a universal access pathway from the Wollongong Free Shuttle Bus Stop. Provide improved pedestrian links to the University of Wollongong
 - 2 Reimagine Glasshouse and Temperate Garden Zone
 - 3 Subject to funding refurbish and/or interpret the Five Islands Fountain
 - 4 Market test permissible commercial nature-based activations which align with the Plan of Management and site values
 - 5 Improve permeability and access with adjoining areas
 - 6 Proposed Upgraded Entry Zone including New Toilets with Lift and Change Facilities, additional BBQ Facilities and Timed Parking
 - 7 Manage aeration and water quality of Duck Pond
 - 8 Enhance Asian collection and interpretation in the Middle Creek area
 - 9 Upgrade Amphitheatre event space with improved drainage and access, lighting and temporary event infrastructure as needed
 - 10 Culture and Heritage Precinct including Gleniffer Brae Manor House, key views and Sorensen Garden. Precinct managed as per the Gleniffer Brae Conservation Management Plan
 - 11 Collaborate with WollCon about use of the precinct for education, events and activation
 - 12 Trial local rainforest species for street trees adjacent to entrance
 - 13 Contemporise amenities and infrastructure at Kooloobong Oval to support use
